

**BEAUTIFUL MONUMENT.**—We yesterday visited the marble works of T. & J. Muldoon, on John street, where we were shown a superior piece of workmanship, consisting of a monument, erected by Dr. Jno. C. Campbell to the memory of his son Samuel Sprigg Campbell. A pile of rough boulders, from the crevices of which grow water lilies and mosses, is surmounted by a beautiful cross in striking imitation of the limbs of the hickory tree, and upon which is hung a wreath of ivy. The value of this monument, which is seven feet high, is nine hundred dollars, and its quaint, unique style renders it worth seeing. These gentlemen have only been engaged here for eight months, yet are rapidly establishing an enviable reputation in their line of business. A brother of this firm is established in the marble trade at Cararra Italy, and their facilities for furnishing the finest Italian marble are unequalled. The Messrs. Muldoon are about beginning a fine monument for the venerable Mrs. Cruger, which will cost probably twelve hundred dollars, and be one of the finest things of the kind ever built in the city.
