**ANDREW J. CLARK**  
 Andrew J. Clark of Quimby, Iowa, 88, considered the oldest man in Cherokee County, where he lived for 64 years, died at 6 o'clock Thursday evening. He is survived by two sons, John of Quimby, with whom he lived, and Isaac of Sioux City, and two daughters, Mrs. E. Tully, of Cherokees and Mrs. J. J. Mahoney of Quimby.  
 Funeral services were held Sunday at the Federated Church at Quimby at 2 p. m., with Rev. R. C. Mitchell in charge. Burial was made in the Quimby cemetery. The body remained at Davons funeral parlor until the time of the service.  
 Clark was born in this county, where he received his education and assisted his father on the home farm until 21 years of age. Two and a half years of experience as a farm hand in Black Hawk county, Iowa, was followed by several years spent in Kansas and again in several counties of Iowa until he moved to Cherokee County.  
 On Mar. 16, 1888, Clark married Miss Rosanna Taylor who died several years ago. They celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in 1908.

**REUBEN E. DULL**  
 Well-known citizen of this county, residing near New Paris, died Monday morning at 1 o'clock at his home, death being attributed to complications. He was taken ill on Christmas day, last year and had been confined to his home ever since. He was born at Schellsburg, July 21, 1864, a son of Michael and Eliza Dull and was united in marriage with Maggie E. Corie, on Sept. 6, 1888, who survives with the following children: Grace, wife of C. S. Wirrick; Laura, wife of E. H. Benning and Oscar E. Dull, all of Detroit; Irene, wife of N. J. Brum, Johnstown; Olive, wife of Blair Gordon, New Paris and Fred, at the home and one sister, Mrs. Estelle Berkheimer of Berlin, Pa., and Mr. John Dull, Bedford, a nephew. He was a member of the U. B. Church, New Paris. Funeral services were conducted at New Paris in the Evangelical Church on Wednesday afternoon, in charge of his pastor, Rev. Eminhizer.
