

MRS. P. L. FISCHER

Operator of Chapel Hill Dairy
Farm Succumbs to Brief
Illness Tuesday

Mrs. Phillippina Lasch Fischer, 69, widow of Louis Fischer and owner and operator of the Chapel Hill Dairy Farm, died Tuesday night at 10 o'clock at her home on the farm, near Triadelphia.

Mrs. Fischer had been ill for two weeks and critically ill since last Friday.

She was born in Dresden, Germany, May 28, 1867, a daughter of Simon and Elizabeth Ebbert Lasch, and came to Wheeling directly from Dresden when 14 years old. Mrs. Fischer had resided at the Chapel Hill Dairy Farm for the past 42 years. She was married to Louis Fischer in 1899 and he preceded her in death 14 years ago. Mrs. Fischer was a member of St. Mark's Lutheran church, Elm Grove.

Surviving are three sons, George F., William A. and Louis C. Fischer, all at home; two brothers, Jacob and Adam Lasch, of Elm Grove; a sister, Mrs. George F. Dorsch, Sr., of Warwood, and five grandchildren.

The body was removed to the Crider funeral home, Elm Grove, and this evening will be returned to the late residence.

Funeral services are to be conducted at the home Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. William J. Hausmann, pastor of St John's Evangelical church, will officiate. Greenwood cemetery is to be the place of interment.
